GETTING A NORTH CAROLINA DRIVER'S LICENSE

If you are 18 or older, you may apply for a Driver's License in the state of North Carolina. The following sites are available for viewing complete information:

What to Do:

- Download and study the Driver's Handbook (listed above). You will have to take a written test
 and a driving test even if you already have an International license. If you have never had any
 Driver's Education classes, or have never had a license in your home country, you should
 consider attending a Driving School. You may find information about local schools on the
 internet.
- 2. Gather your identification documents.
 - You must have a proof of identity such as a birth certificate (if born in the US), a passport, your I-20, and your <u>I-94</u>. To obtain an I-94, go to this website: https://i94.cbp.dhs.gov/194/request.html. Fill out the form and print the I-94.
 - In addition, you must have proof of residency, such as your official transcript (obtainable at the Registrar's office) or a bank statement sent to your Southeastern address. These must be ORIGINAL documents—no copies.
- 3. Making an appointment at the DMV one week before you plan to take the test is advisable. It can cut down on the wait time. There is usually a line at the DMV, and it is not uncommon to wait an hour or two before being called. This process can take up to a couple of hours or more, so don't plan to go on a morning when you have classes.
- 4. Obtain Non-Owner's Insurance from the insurance carrier of your choice. Usually there is a deposit of around \$150, with monthly payments ranging from \$135 and up, depending on driving experience, age, and driving record (if you have one). You must have this insurance coverage prior to taking the driving portion of the test.
- 5. On the morning of the test, bring all of your documents including proof of insurance, along with cash or a check for \$32 to pay for the license. You must have a vehicle to drive for the driving test. As such, be sure to bring a licensed friend (who has a car) with you to the DMV.

Required Documents:

- Passport or Birth Certificate
- I-20
- I-94
- A copy of your official transcript
